



KINCOPPAL-ROSE BAY - LARGEST SCHOOL SOLAR POWER SYSTEM IN SYDNEY'S EAST

With the help of the Solar my School program, Kincoppal–Rose Bay has gone solar. The school has installed 338 panels on the MTC (otherwise known as the Maureen Tudehope Centre) to provide locally generated, green energy to power the school’s sports, music and performing arts facilities. Annually they will:



Save **24%** on facility’s energy bill



Produce enough power equal to running **745 computers** or **26 homes**



Reduce carbon emissions by **133 tonnes**



Equivalent to taking **47 cars** off the road
